



## EVENTS FOR SCHOOLS AT NORWICH CASTLE:

### KS3 Transatlantic Slavery

#### Essential information

Maximum group size 120, £5 per student, 10am until 2pm

#### The event

Explore transatlantic slavery in this drama-based day. Meet costumed characters and learn what it was like to be an enslaved person or an owner of enslaved African people, discovering some of the arguments for and against transatlantic slavery that existed in the early 19th century. Plus examine documents from Norfolk Record Office and discover the role that Norfolk played both in the trade of enslaved African people and in its abolition.

#### Learning outcomes

- Know and understand how people's lives have been influenced by transatlantic slavery up to the present day.
- Gain historical perspective by understanding the role Norfolk played in this national and international issue.
- Meet characters from the time, hear arguments for and against transatlantic slavery, and understand why people held these views.
- Explore the human and moral issues around the trade in enslaved African people in a drama workshop.
