



EVENTS FOR SCHOOLS AT NORWICH CASTLE:

KS3 Slavery

Essential information

Maximum group size 120, £5 per student, 10am until 2pm

The event

Explore the Atlantic trade in enslaved humans in this drama-based day. Meet costumed characters and learn what it was like to be an enslaved person or an enslaver, discovering some of the arguments for and against slavery that existed in the early 19th century.

Plus examine documents from Norfolk Record Office and discover the role that Norfolk played both in slavery and in its abolition.

Learning outcomes

- Know and understand how people's lives have been influenced by the Atlantic slave trade up to the present day.
- Gain historical perspective by understanding the role Norfolk played in this national and international issue.
- Meet characters from the time, hear arguments for and against the slave trade, and understand why people held these views.
- Explore the human and moral issues in slavery and the trade in enslaved humans in a drama workshop.
