


Medicine: General hospital and hospital ships

General hospital

Most of these were near channel ports and were capable of dealing with all kinds of wounds and sickness. Patients who recovered fully would be sent back to a unit via the Infantry Brigade Depot. Those requiring further treatment but fit to travel went to the UK by ambulance train and hospital ship.



Hospital ships

Hospital ships, although clearly identified, had to run the gauntlet of mines and submarines. Numbers of them were sunk, including the **Anglia** in November 1915. One of the casualties was staff nurse Mary Radwell, who is commemorated on Ditchingham Memorial.
