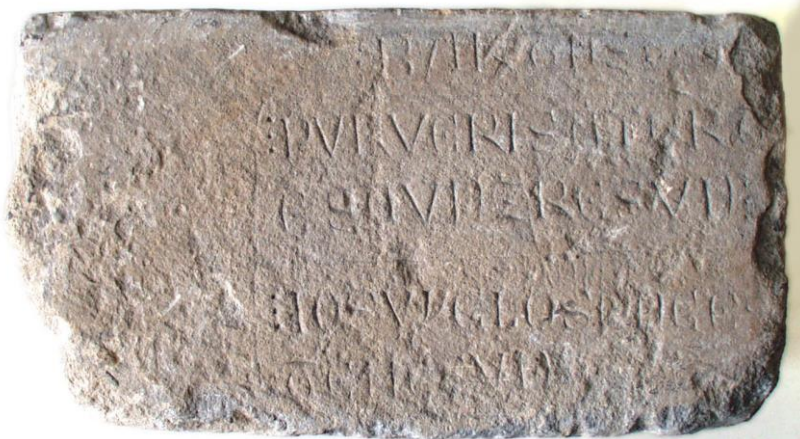
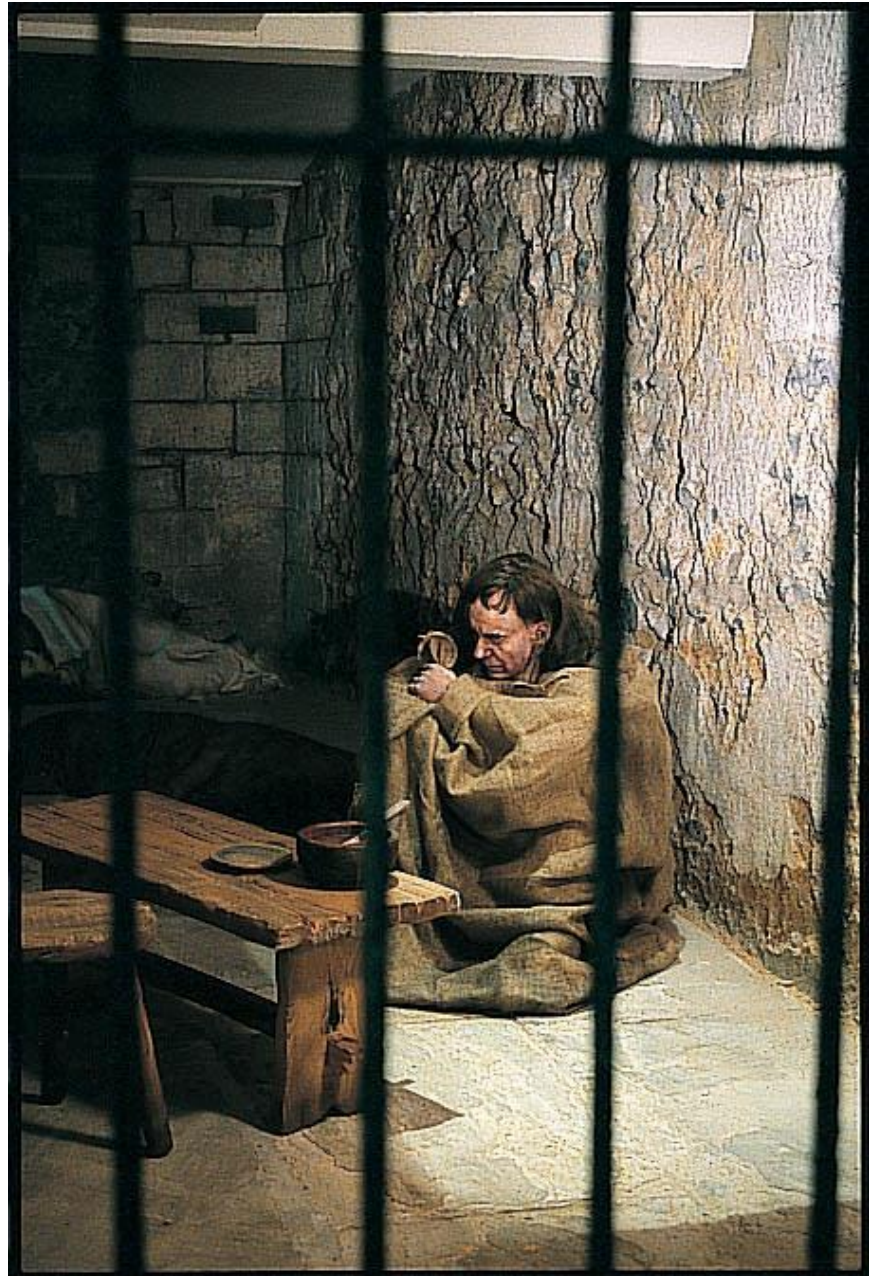


Reconstruction

This stone from the Castle was probably carved in the 13<sup>th</sup> or 14<sup>th</sup> centuries and is the earliest direct evidence of a named prisoner here. The text, in Norman French, simply says: 'Bartholomew, truly wrongfully and without reason, I am shut in this prison.'
