



KS2 Life in Tudor Norwich at the Time of Robert Kett

Strangers' Hall, max group size 60, £5 per pupil

Tudor Norwich, 1550: Kett's Rebellion has just been put down, and the people of the city have different opinions about it.

Meet four costumed characters, who'll take you through a series of activities that bring to life Norwich in 1550. Meet citizens and a rebel and weigh up their opinions about the rebellion, plus handle and investigate historic objects from the time.

With the mayor, learn about the point of view of the rich and find out about the kind of feasts enjoyed by the gentry. Plus hear a rebel's side of the story, try on Tudor clothes with a tailor, and share a weaver's expertise as you create something to take back to school.

Aims and learning outcomes

History

- Inspire pupils' curiosity about the past and equip them to ask perceptive questions, think critically, weigh evidence, sift arguments and develop perspective and judgement.
- Raise awareness and understanding of an important event in local and national history.
- Engage children with museum objects as sources of inspiration, knowledge and exploration.
- Expand children's understanding of the culture and beliefs of people during the period.
