KS3 Norwich in the Industrial Revolution

The event

Bring the Industrial Revolution to life! Handle and analyse real items used by Norwich industries, study documents focusing on Norwich's most famous export— Colman's Mustard — and follow an educational trail around the museum's Industrial displays. Teachers will also be able to lead students on a tour of nearby post-industrial sites (maps and details included).

This event usually takes place at Norwich Castle and the Museum of Norwich.

Learning outcomes

- Know and understand how people's lives have shaped this nation and how Britain has influenced and been influenced by the wider world.
- Understand historical concepts such as continuity and change, cause and consequence.
- Understand the methods of historical enquiry, including how evidence is used rigorously to make historical claims.
- Gain historical perspective by placing growing knowledge into difference contexts, understanding the connections between local, regional, national and international history; between cultural, economic and social history; and between short- and long-term timescales.
