Gateway to Medieval England is a four year project that will transform the magnificent Keep within Norwich Castle back to its appearance under the great Norman Kings.

Norwich Castle is an historic building of international importance, dominating the skyline and has remained a constant in the City for over 1000 years.

Despite its familiarity and prominence the elaborate Romanesque Keep is not widely appreciated.

This project will restore the lost architectural grandeur and bring to life one of Europe's most important 12th century secular buildings, at the heart of one of its most complete medieval cities.

In response to feedback from an extensive programme of consultation with stakeholders and audiences the project will restore the past and secure a glorious future for our great City.





The project will:

- Secure the future of the 900-year-old monument and interpret the building in engaging and historically accurate ways
- Reinstate the medieval floor levels of the Keep to make all five levels fully accessible, from basement to battlements
- Develop a new medieval gallery in partnership with the British Museum that will showcase nationally important medieval treasures
- Transform the quality and depth of the visitor experience from arrival in the Castle grounds
- Create a powerful learning experience for families, community groups and schools

The result will be:

- The transformation of Norwich Castle into the premier heritage attraction in the East of England, attracting 300,000 visitors per year
- An inspirational learning resource for Norfolk's schools with the capacity to welcome 30,000 school children per year
- A greatly enhanced regional and international profile for Norwich as a major cultural tourism destination
- A positive and significant economic impact for local businesses in terms of creating jobs, providing skills, giving training opportunities and a destination for hospitality and events
